Update from PC	
Welcome to new faces, hoping to see again in the future. Also welcome	
to Mr Lyon in a different role in this meeting as Interim Head	
Teacher.	
Congratulations to Mr & Mrs Parke on their arrival of baby Parke.	
Quite a quiet term last term but behind the scenes was busy, jumping	
in and out of different meetings on matters arising. Do have a busy	
term ahead, we might be looking for help with events etc.	
Head Teacher Update/Report (see attached document)	
ES - at a previous PC meeting it was talked about the changing of boundaries and with Duncan Forbes Primary not at capacity, we thought it (new enrolments) were going to be filtered for children coming to Smithton?	
JL - I am aware of situation at Cradlehall Nursery being capped at 17 children (in their Nursery) due to renovations happening which has had an impact on us and our numbers going forward. It is inconvenient for Cradlehall parents to pick up children from our nursery and then pick up older children already in Cradlehall so they are looking to move both/all children to Smithton. I was aware of a proposal for a new primary school in the area or high school, but these plans are not currently going forward.	
ES - I am worried for my eldest going to academy, already at 140% capacity with no help and no money to start the rebuild of Culloden Academy.	
CH - we have been in contact with Fiona Shearer as part of recruitment so can bring it up with her and bring back to the Parent Council.	

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CT - what was the figure for Head Teachers who would not encourage being a Head Teacher?

JL - it was a union survey, one of the questions was if we felt supported by our employer and HC were one of the worst. Survey was carried out at the same time as surveys for PTs.

CH - recruitment is still happening to fill Head Teacher post, third time going to advert but myself, Rebecca and Holly have been active in process and have been in regular meetings with Fiona Shearer. Will be doing some things next week and there will be more outcomes following that confidential process.

CT - are there any alternative plans? Grouping heads together, etc. (if no one found to be successful)

CH - we have been more than helpful (to Council) with ideas going forward and all other HT posts are still unfilled as well.

RM - we have continually asked for a back-up plan when interviews have not been successful. This will be the final time it is readvertised.

JL - there is an assurance from me that I will continue in post until I can.

AN - staff agree that the transition has been smooth for all, and we all have confidence in Jim going forward until someone in post.

CT - agreed and reflected from parents as well.

## Overview from other meetings attended

PC keeping an eye on the PT situation - our PTs have been asked to step up despite the decision being made to remove them from role, have asked how the work is being rolled out once PTs do leave their roles within school.

JL - PTs are already not being replaced with retirements and maternity leave.

Claire has taken on Highland Parent Council Partnership – two meetings have happened with Scottish Cabinet for Education (in March); questions regarding behaviour, PTs, school buildings and wide range of other issues.

HPCP meeting (in April) - talked about outcome of previous meeting and raised a lot of questions with Scottish Government which should come from Local Authorities rather than PC. Interested to see what written responses say and will pass on to members.

No feedback given from discussions during meeting, but CH will circulate once given out.

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Nicky Grant was on approved leave and has now left her post (was main contact for Highland PC); moving forward there are interim solutions in place, so we still have a channel of communication with Highland Council.

RM attended Collection of PCs - more to discuss concerns and issues in schools and identify if these concerns/issues are similar or different. Was a productive discussion, consensus was met about stability regarding headship and what as a parent group we can do to push Council or Scottish Government to act. Questions such as what can parents do on mass? Where can this go to support the schools? Everyone was in support, have issue with Local Authority and Scottish Government. Will bring more info as develops, second meeting to happen.

Any questions from PC members to be passed on to CH or RM to take forward to next meeting.

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## Policy, Procedure and Learning

As previously discussed, Aileen came up with a Parent Charter for parents to commit to in the same way the school commits to teaching their children - for example making sure children come to school on time.

Carol & Holly had initial brainstorm with Aileen, allowed us to get thoughts down between group. Good idea to leave for next HT, currently on hold.

On hold until new Head Teacher is put in post to get their thoughts included.

## Walking from Home Policy - name to be confirmed

Encompasses everything from how we give permission to having younger children going home/coming to school themselves/after school clubs etc. Stress that the school is not responsible for the children until 9am each day.

JL - unsure who is responsible for the child once they have left the house but will investigate legalities.

ES - Smithton have chosen to have staff in the playground from 08:45am to ensure children are safe.

In a working draft for PC members to view before agreeing. It is unlikely to be this term - early in August.

#### Racism

CH approached by a parent whose child was receiving comments about the colour of their skin, asked PC if they could work with the school to develop learning in the school. Open to suggestions and people to be on working group with JL to put in place.

Suggestions to be put forward to CH

ES - could Learning Council be involved?

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JL - the parent themselves has a breadth of experience from the past situation the child has been in and their own educational experience from where they originate from that we can use as a way of helping to educate us. We do have a wide range of cultural backgrounds in the school and anything we can do to tackle racism, we will support.

### Parking

Iain Graham (contact at HC) has not been in contact with Claire, so we are back at the beginning with finding out how to move forward.

CH to email councillors with a contact and has had contact with Road Safety officer.

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#### Wrap Around Care

Questionnaires were posted on Facebook page for morning and after school, we have gone forward with 24 names and have exceeded that number and are now looking to identify rooms - 15 classes may jeopardise this?

JL - we do have extra rooms and space and can be flexible, with priority for this. We have the capacity.

Next step to put forward plans to Care Inspectorate as a new service. Progressing well in the background but will still be a 6month turnaround with this due to recruitment and moving forward. Wide range of children to be included from across the school.

CT - who will run it?

CH - Highland Council will recruit staff.

Asked why JL thought we were above average, and he took her on a walk around the school. She could see the relationships present, the calmness and adaptability of the staff to ongoing situations. We (as a school) do have some challenges with some attendance and across Scotland there has been an increase but Smithton are bucking the trend and are putting it down to the ethos within the school with our fostering of relationships.
